

population (2018)


Municipalities by number of inhabitants, 2018

1. Challenge – size of capacity





Integrated territorial investments (ITI) - 9 largest cities


Specific Objective

2.Challenge - administrative system

A. Lack of competition


- Municipality ignores deadlines for project submission
- Lack of quality of project applications

B. Administrative burdens by delegation of tasks of intermediate body to municipalities

- Evaluation process is expensive committee for limited number of projects
- It is difficult to ensure the independence of evaluation committee evaluation committee as an «internal enemy»
- Reduce capacity in the project preparation process



3.Challenge - knowledge



Effective use of instruments responding to:

A. Global challenges:

- Climate change
- Globalization migration and free movement of capital


B. National-local challenges:

- Regional disparities
- Demographics
- Urban-Rural cooperation (administrative changes)



Size of capacity – territorial reform (1)

Latvia currently implements administrative-territorial reform, consolidating municipal resources in much stronger territorial units



119 municipalities

39 municipalities

Size of capacity – territorial reform (2)

Functional areas

 80% of municipalities will be able to provide jobs to inhabitants in the territory of the particular municipality (currently – only 27% of municipalities)

Investment capacity

 All municipalities will have a capacity of the municipal budget for investments amounting up to 30 000 000 euro (currently – only 39% of municipalities)

Administrative capacity

 All municipalities will be able to ensure appropriate competences, including in development planning and entrepreneurship issues (currently only 50% of municipalities have full-time specialists)


Human capital

 All municipalities will have sufficient number of children to provide full education cycle till general education (currently – only 45% of municipalities)



Administrative system - positive competition

- **1)Approach** (EU funds for business support and services, excl. pre-school education and capacity):
 - Regional disparities GDP criterion and thematic concentration for less developed regions
 - Most competitive projects regional competition for municipalities (70% of funding)
 - Target areas funding for regional scale projects (30% of funding)

Preparatory work to launch new local governments 2021



- Administrative innovations:
 - ✓ Participatory budged
 - Municipalities Council's agenda and collective application
 - ✓ Consultative mechanisms
- Preparation of new administrative structures – base for urban-rural cooperation
- Planning process in new administrative frame (preparation of draft planning documents)



Annual capacity building event - Summer School

- ➤ Since 2016
- ➤ Participants ~ 60 development planners and project experts per year
- > Topics covered:
 - smart solutions in provision of public services
 - project management
 - > communication skills
 - improvement of job efficiency, etc.





Knowledge - capacity building (EU funds 2021-2027)



Intervention logic – support of new administrations ensuring effective use of new tools, including:

- Improved quality of development planning documents, link with the budget
- Public participation in territory development planning and implementation
- Planning based on real-time data
- Better cooperation with entrepreneurs
- Better urban rural linkages
- Smart approach, including adopting to the demographic changes, awareness of impact on climate change addressing measures etc.

Long-term result – investments that are integrated and based on needs of territories and their development potential, beneficial effects on sustainability of territories and balanced development
